## Thank You!

**IT'S BEEN TWO MONTHS**, and we're still happily stunned by Give!Guide's final results. Say it with us, Portland: \$9,261,174. That's a lot of help for local groups that could really use it.

Results like this don't happen without a community behind them. We're deeply grateful to 17,584 donors, 277 participating organizations, 709 business partners, 36 donor incentive and prize partners, and 16 sponsors. Every one of them helped lift up local nonprofits during a tough year.

Those nonprofits had been dogged by unpredictable challenges during 2025 — like erratic executive orders, federal grant rescissions, and SNAP benefit freezes. For some, Give!Guide's success meant the difference between keeping the doors open or laying off staff and shutting down programs. So they began doing even more with even less. And they did all of this knowing a recent Associated Press poll reported the great majority of Americans didn't plan to give in the final months of 2025.

Portland and our metro-area neighbors proved otherwise. More than 73,886 separate gifts ran through [giveguide.org](https://giveguide.org) in just 61 days. Most were small-dollar gifts — 59,263 were \$100 or less — but they added up and helped unlock much larger pools of matching funds from big-hearted individuals and companies. A growing number of people also made six-figure gifts, spreading their generosity across multiple organizations. As one donor said, "I wish I could fund all the groups." All 277 of them!

# A CLOSER LOOK

at the numbers

## THE MONEY CAME FROM ACROSS AMERICA, BUT MOSTLY PORTLAND.

Once again, Portland rose to the occasion. While 87% of total donations came from Oregon, and a large majority from Portland proper, Give!Guide continues to attract supporters from across the country. This year donors came from every state (except Mississippi — 2026 goals!), plus Washington D.C.

Supporters across the Western states showed up in a big way, especially our next-door neighbors to the north and south, along with plenty of PDX-loving snowbirds in Arizona. But the generosity didn't stop there. The list includes donors from every corner of the country, with Ohio, Colorado, and Massachusetts breaking into the top 10 this year.

Within Portland, the most generous ZIP codes were in Southeast, followed by Northeast, Southwest, Northwest, and North. As always, there were plenty of creative spellings of Portland, from evergreen favorite Porgland to the charmingly chaotic Porrtland54.

Most gifts came through the platform, with additional support arriving via mailed checks from donor advised funds, IRA distributions, and foundations.

## THE FIVE *Biggest* DAYS

Around here we say that Give!Guide is a marathon not a sprint, but truth be told — there are indeed a few mad dashes along the way. Here's a peek at the five biggest days for Give!Guide 2025.

### 1. \$1,401,801 ON DECEMBER 31

Final day of the campaign! New Year's Eve is always an exciting day for Give!Guide, and this year was no different. We blasted past our goal around 10 pm, and the blitz continued till the clock struck midnight.

### 2. \$1,262,485 ON DECEMBER 30

A Shakespeare-themed getaway to Southern Oregon anchored Big Culture Day and raised nearly \$175,000 more than this BGD did last year. Heigh, my hearts!

### 3. \$673,437 ON DECEMBER 29

For the first time ever, Big E-Bike Day, sponsored by our longtime partners at Splendid Cycles, was scheduled for the final stretch — and it paid off! A whopping 6,883 donors vied for this incredible prize.

### 4. \$648,611 ON DECEMBER 2

This turbo-boosted Big Blazers (and March Madness!) Day was paired with GivingTuesday, an annual day of global giving to inspire generosity in our community. This was the first BIG day of the campaign and kicked off a record-breaking December for Give!Guide.

### 5. \$505,290 ON DECEMBER 27

Rounding out the top five is perennial favorite Big Books Day, sponsored by Powell's Books. This Big Give Day was the first of our final-stretch heavy hitters — and the bookworms came through for Give!Guide.

# CAMPAIGN REACH

## TRACKING *the* GENEROSITY

Between November 1 and December 31, we welcomed nearly 190,000 unique users to our website. On average, each visitor clicked through 5.8 pages, with the nonprofit profiles, Big Give Days, and checkout (woo!) pages drawing the most traffic.

Well over half of our website visitors logged on from their desktop device, while most of the remainder used their mobile devices. And nine of you kicked back on the couch and logged on through your smart TVs.

## WHAT GOT *People* TALKING *and* CLICKING?

Our newsletters are the best way to keep our supporters in the loop. Thank you for welcoming us into your inbox for two months every year. This year, our Big Beach Day email inspired the largest number of people to click over to our website. An email about the matching gift challenge from CareOregon and a letter from Give!Guide founder Richard Meeker notched the most opens.

On Instagram and Facebook, our most popular posts were the ones that kept followers up to speed as the campaign progressed. We generated the most views the day the Give!Guide Kickoff issue of *Willamette Week* was published, followed by Kickoff Day and two Big Give Days (Big Flights and Big Garden). Our posts in the final hours of the campaign rounded out the top six, as folks tuned in to see Give!Guide topple its ambitious fundraising goal.

When it comes to clicks that brought people to our website, Big Give Days ruled supreme on social media: Posts on Big Flight Day, Big Garden Day, Big Beach Day, and Big Relaxing Day were the most popular!

# YOUNG DONORS, Big Impact



## THOUSANDS OF SUPPORTERS UNDER 35 STEPPED UP

At the heart of *Willamette Week's* Give!Guide is a bold mission: inspiring a new generation of givers and cultivating a culture of engaged, compassionate philanthropy. That's why we focus on growing the number of donors age 35 and under.

This year, 2,397 young donors gave \$336,855. On average, each one supported three nonprofits. **Human Services** topped the charts again this year with the most money raised from 35 and under donors, with **Civil & Human Rights** and **Community** rounding out the top three. Honorable mention goes to the **Environment** category, which had the largest number of donations from 35 and under donors.

This fall, we celebrated four remarkable individuals doing exceptional work for Portland-area nonprofits. Each Skidmore Prize winner is the embodiment of community dedication, a testament to the power of passion and purpose.

This year's winners, spanning three nonprofit categories, shared their compelling stories and the lived experiences
